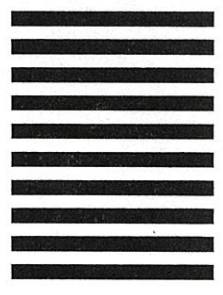

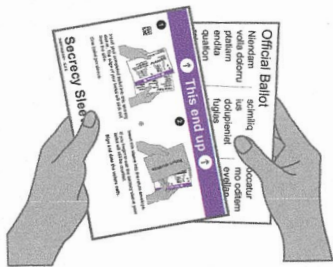
**Voter's Oath:** I swear or affirm under penalty of perjury that I am a qualified registered voter in the District of Columbia who is eligible to cast a ballot in this election, that I am voting only once in this election, and that I am not voting in any other jurisdiction for this election. I understand that if I make any false statements about my qualifications to vote, vote more than once in this election, or vote in any other jurisdiction for this election, I may, upon conviction, be fined up to \$10,000 and/or jailed for up to five years. I also understand that voting more than once in this election may result in a fine of up to \$2,000.

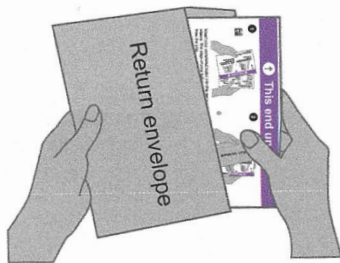

### IMPORTANT NOTICE TO FIRST-TIME VOTERS WHO REGISTERED BY MAIL OR ONLINE

Our records indicate that you have not previously voted in a federal election in the District of Columbia, and that you registered online or by mail without providing a copy of your identification (ID).

Under federal and District of Columbia law, you are required to provide a copy of one of the following ID documents with your voted mail ballot:

- A copy of a current and valid government-issued photo ID; **OR**
- A copy of a current\* utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government-issued document that shows your name and address.

*\*The issue, bill, or statement date must be no earlier than ninety (90) days before the election. The 90<sup>th</sup> day before the June 4, 2024 Primary Election is March 6, 2024.*

### PLACE A COPY OF YOUR ID DOCUMENT INSIDE THE BALLOT RETURN ENVELOPE.

If you do not provide a copy of your ID document with your voted ballot, your ballot will be treated as a special (provisional) ballot, and will not be counted unless you submit a copy of your ID to the Board of Elections by 4:45 pm on Tuesday, June 11, 2024.
