**DCBOE to Conduct Absentee Voting at  
Central Detention Facility and Central Treatment Facility**

**WASHINGTON, D.C.** – Members of the Outreach Division and the General Counsel’s Office of the District of Columbia Board of Elections (DCBOE) will be visiting the Central Detention and Central Treatment Facilities to assist members of the justice system involved community as they cast their ballots in the 2018 General Election. CDF and CTF residents, not serving a sentence for a felony conviction, are eligible to vote absentee so long as their request for an absentee ballot is received by the Board before October 29, 2018.

Board staff will arrive at both facilities on October 31 at 9:30 am to begin absentee voting, and will leave timely requested ballots with case managers for voters who are unavailable on October 31. Any ballots left behind will be picked up by DCBOE staff on November 2.

The Board has been conducting absentee voting at both Facilities for the last several election cycles, and remains committed to enfranchising all eligible District residents.
