1 P-R-O-C-E-E-D-I-N-G-S 2 10:40 a.m. CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Good morning. 3 will call to order the regular meeting of the 4 5 Board of Elections for June 2015. It is Wednesday, June 3. The time is 10:42 a.m. 6 We are meeting in 280 North of One Judiciary Square. 7 I'm Deborah K. Nichols, Chairman of 8 9 the Board of Elections. Present with me this 10 morning is Board Member Stephen Danzansky. Also 11 present this morning Mr. Clifford Tatum, the 12 Board's Executive Director; Ms. Cecily Collier-13 Montgomery, the Board's Director of Campaign 14 Finance. 15 Good morning. MS. COLLIER-MONTGOMERY: CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: And Mr. Kenneth 16 17 McGhie, the Board's General Counsel. 18 Without objection the agenda for this 19 morning's meeting is adopted. 20 MEMBER DANZANSKY: No objection. 21 CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Unless there are 22 corrections, the minutes of the regular board

meeting of Thursday, May 14, 2015 are adopted. 1 2 Are there any matters that Board Member Danzansky wishes to address in this public 3 4 meeting? 5 MEMBER DANZANSKY: None, Madam Chair, other than to congratulate the staff on an 6 efficient and effective recount. That is a 7 significant effort to be open and clear on rules 8 9 and procedures and it obviously worked as the 10 statute intended it to. I want to congratulate the staff publicly for a job well done. 11 12 CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: And I wish to 13 associate myself with your comments in that 14 regard. 15 All right. We will now receive the 16 report of the Board's Executive Director, Mr. 17 Tatum. 18 MR. TATUM: Madam Chair, I have two 19 items on the report today; the report on the 20 April 28 Special Election Recount and General 21 Matters. 22 The recount was scheduled to commence

on May 28, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at the request of Mr. White. Mr. White identified four precincts that he wanted us to begin the recount with. those precincts were 115, 117, 120, and 134. For the record, precinct 134 and 115 were in the same physical location on April 28th.

The Board began its recount with 15 temporary employees and five full-time staff members. After completing the hand tally of the ballots for those four precincts at roughly 2:33 p.m. in the afternoon we provided Mr. White's representative with a hand tally of what the vote totals were compared to the recount as to the certified results.

We gave them an actual cost incurred number to indicate this is how much you've incurred as of these four precincts. As a result of that information provided, the representative asked us to suspend the recount until she could talk with Mr. White to determine whether he wanted to proceed.

At roughly 11:00 p.m. on May 28th we

received an email from Mr. White requesting us to terminate the recount. On May 29th we submitted a confirming email indicating that we had indeed stopped the count. We sent that email to Mr. White, to the representative, as well as to Mr. White's attorney Lawrence Manley.

Within that email we indicated that we would provide a report of the recount of those four precincts, the supporting documentation that they had requested, which was the ballot accounting forms, as well as the invoice. We have all of those documents ready to be forwarded to Mr. White.

The invoice for a total of 15
temporary employees who worked a total of six
hours at a rate of \$20 per hour we generated
actual cost of \$1,800. We had one security guard
contracted from, I believe, DGS for 16 hours for
two days. That totaled \$476.80 for a subtotal of
\$2,276.80.

Mr. White made a deposit of \$850 for requesting a 15 precinct recount but his deposit

1	was greater than that. It was actually 17
2	precincts so we deducted the \$850 from the
3	\$2,276.80 which leaves him with an outstanding
4	balance of \$1,426.80. We will forward this
5	invoice to Mr. White today along with to his
6	attorney and representative and request the
7	invoice indicates payment is due upon receipt.
8	That concludes my matter on the
9	recount report. For general matters, I have no
10	general matters at this time.
11	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right. Okay.
12	Thank you, Mr. Tatum.
13	
14	Any questions for Mr. Tatum?
15	All right. We will move on to the
16	Report of General Counsel, Mr. McGhie.
17	MR. McGHIE: I have two things on the
18	agenda. The first one is Office of Campaign
19	Finance Petitions for Enforcement. I would call
20	to the table General Counsel for the Office of
21	Campaign Finance, Mr. Sanford, and Rudolph McGann

from my office.

1	Anytime you are ready, Mr. McGann.
2	MR. McGANN: Good morning, Board. The
3	first matter is OCF Docket No. 14C-075.
4	Respondent's name is Martin Sterbal, treasurer.
5	He failed to timely file his October 10th report
6	of receipts and expenditures which was due
7	October 10, 2014. The effective date of the
8	order was January 2nd.
9	The transmittal was March 3rd. He has
10	not appeared at any of the prehearings set before
11	the Board, one on the 21st of April and one on
12	the 6th of May this year. He was given notice of
13	this hearing on May 27th. I believe he is
14	present.
15	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: You want to do them
16	one at a time or
17	
18	MR. McGANN: All at one time. The
19	next matter is OCF Docket No. 14C-073.
20	Respondent's name is Darrell Gaston, treasurer.
21	Failure to timely file an October 10th report of
22	receipts and expenditures that was due Friday,

October 10, 2014.

The fine amount is \$1,900. The effective date of the order was January 2nd and it was transmitted to the Board on March 3rd.

Mr. Gaston did not appear at either of the hearings scheduled for April 21st and May 6th.

He was informed of this hearing on May 27th and he is not present.

Next is Christian Carter, OCF Docket No. 14C-072, failure to file the October 10th report of receipts and expenditures due October 10, 2014. The OCF order date was December 8, 2014, fined in the amount of \$1,900.

The effective date of the order was January 2nd and the transmittal was March 3rd.

Mr. Carter has not appeared at the prehearing scheduled for him on April 21st and May 6th and he is not here today.

Two matters involving Mr. James

Caviness. One is 14C-069, failure to file the

October 10th report of receipts and expenditures

due October 10th. That fine was in the amount of

\$1,900. The order was filed December 8th effective January 2nd and transmitted to the Board on March 3rd. Mr. Caviness did not appear for his prehearings scheduled for the 21st of April and May 6th and he is not here today.

The other matter involving Mr.

Caviness -- bear with me. Excuse me -- is OCF

Docket No. 14C-050, failure to timely file the

August 10th report of receipts and expenditures.

A fine was rendered in the amount of \$1,650.

The order was on October 24th,
effective November 18th, transmitted on March
3rd. Mr. Caviness, again, as aforementioned, did
not appear in either the prehearings scheduled
for this matter and is not here today.

The next matter is Mr. Villareal Johnson, OCF Docket No. 14C-068, failure to timely file the July 31st report of receipts and expenditures due August 18, 2014. The order was rendered December 17, 2014 for a fine in the amount of \$2,000.

The effective date was January 12th

and the transmittal to the Board was on March 3rd. Mr. Johnson did not appear at either the prehearing scheduled for him on April 21st and May 6th and he is not here today.

The next matter is OCF Petition 14C-056, Mr. Kevin Valentine, treasurer, failure to timely file an August 10th report of receipts and expenditures due August 11, 2014. The order date was October 24, 2014 and the fine was in the amount of \$100. Mr. Valentine did not appear before the Board for a prehearing conference on April 21 nor May 6th and he is not present today.

I believe those seven matters are the matters that we have. Mr. Sanford would like to concur.

MR. SANFORD: I would concur with that. I believe that's all we have today.

CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right. I will entertain a motion to authorize the Board's

Office of the General Counsel to enforce the OCF petitions for violations of the Campaign Finance office.

1	MEMBER DANZANSKY: So moved, Madam			
2	Chair.			
3	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All in favor, aye.			
4	MEMBERS: Aye.			
5	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All opposed. The			
6	ayes have it. The motion carries.			
7	Thank you, Mr. Sanford, Mr. McGann.			
8	MR. SANFORD: Thank you.			
9	MR. McGANN: Thank you.			
10	MEMBER DANZANSKY: Before we leave our			
11	General Counsel, Madam Chair, I just have one			
12	question. We assume that the cost of the recount			
13	the balance of the cost will be paid but in the			
14	event it is not, does it become a receivable to			
15	the District of Columbia or is there a petition			
16	or enforcement mechanism?			
17	MR. McGHIE: It would pretty much be			
18	the same enforcement mechanism. It would be the			
19	same process. So we would come to the Board for			
20	an order allowing us to proceed in Superior Court			
21	to enforce the bill.			
22	MEMBER DANZANSKY: Okay. And it would			

be only against the committee and not against the 1 2 individual? MR. McGHIE: It would be against the 3 4 candidate. 5 MEMBER DANZANSKY: It would be against the candidate? 6 7 MR. McGHIE: Yes. 8 MEMBER DANZANSKY: Very good. Thank 9 you. 10 CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right, Mr. 11 McGhie. Continue. 12 MR. McGHIE: Okay. The only thing I 13 have left is a litigation status update. The Board is familiar with both the cases. The first 14 15 one is Sewell v. DC Board of Elections. 16 a complaint filed alleging harassment. 17 Office of General Counsel filed a motion to 18 dismiss. For some reason Mr. Sewell instead of 19 responding to our motion to dismiss filed his own 20 motion to dismiss. The court granted his motion 21 to dismiss without prejudice on May 12th. 22 CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Without prejudice.

MR. McGHIE: Without prejudice. 1 2 motion was with prejudice. Then the next one is McMillian v. DC 3 Board of Elections. This is in the Court of 4 5 Appeals. Again, we filed a motion to dismiss. He was required to respond to our 6 7 motion on April 23rd. He failed to respond and the court ordered on May 4th that he have until 8 9 today to respond to our motion to dismiss or show 10 cause why it should not be dismissed. We will 11 know at the end of the day what the status is on 12 McMillian. 13 That concludes my litigation status 14 update. 15 CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right. 16 you, Mr. McGhie. 17 We will now receive the report of the 18 Campaign Finance, Cecily Collier-Montgomery. 19 MS. COLLIER-MONTGOMERY: Yes. Good 20 morning again. During the month of May there 21 were no filing deadlines for our candidates and

However, during the month of May we

committees.

did have new candidates and committees who registered to participate in the 2016 election cycle.

Raise the Wage (Initiative Committee for Fair Minimum Wage Act of 2016) registered with the office on May 15, 2015. With our entrance conferences for new participants on May 7, 2015 we held an entrance conference and we had two citizens who appeared; Nellene Lucinda Richardson and Lawrence A. Dixon-Bey.

We had an entrance conference scheduled for June 4, 2015 and that is to be attended by Raise the Wage committee members Edwin Jones, Sr., the treasurer; Jimmie Luthuli, the chairperson; and Delvone Michael, the custodian of records.

With our Audit Branch during the month of May the Audit Branch completed 29 desk reviews. Also in the Audit Branch we do have ongoing audits. We had the full field audit of Gray for Mayor. We have periodic random audits, Committee to Elect Natalie Williams for Ward 8,

Barry for Council, Friends of Leon Andrews, and Tengen for DC.

With the normal committees 2015 we had the DC Proud Inaugural Committee. With our periodic random audits for candidates registered in the 2014 elections we had Ruth for Schools.

With out continuing committees the periodic random audit is being conducted of Morgan for DC. With our constituent service programs we have a periodic random audit which is ongoing of Mayor Bowser Constituent Service Fund.

During the month we also issued several audits. The first was Lori Masters for Attorney General which was issued on May 29th, 2015; Smitty for AG which was issued on May 8, 2015; Brian Hart for DC which was issued on May 7, 2015; the Republican Committee DC which was issued on May 28, 2015; and Ward 3 Constituent Service Fund which was issued on May 28, 2015. All of the audits are available for review by members of the public on our website.

At this point I would ask Mr. Sanford

to give the report of the Office of the General Counsel.

MR. SANFORD: Good morning, Madam
Chairman, and distinguished Board Member
Danzansky. My name is William Sanford, General
Counsel for the Office of Campaign Finance.

During the month of May 2015 the
Office of General Counsel received four referrals
for informal hearings from Reports Analysis and
Audit Division. The Office of the General Counsel
conducted with hearings and issued 18 orders
which included the following:

Five orders were issued for failure to timely file reports in which no funds were imposed. Two orders were issued for failure to timely respond to request for additional information in which no fines were imposed.

Six orders were issued for failure to timely file reports in which \$10,900 in fines were imposed. Two orders were issued for failure to timely respond to a request for additional information in which fines totaling \$3,450 were

imposed and three orders were issued to vacate previous orders based upon the respondent's payment of a fine or motion for reconsideration.

The Office of the General Counsel imposed a total of \$14,350 in fines during the month of May against the following respondents:

The Committee to Elect Villareal

Johnson, failure to timely file the January 31,

2015 report. A fine of \$1,400 was imposed.

Gaston 2014. \$2,500 fine was imposed for failure

to file the March 10, 2015 report of receipts and

expenditures. Bell for Ward 8, \$2,500 fine was

imposed for failure to file March 10, 2015

report.

Acquietta Anderson for Ward 4 counsel received a \$2,000 fine for failure to respond to request for additional information. And Acquietta Anderson again, Ward 4, received a \$1,450 fine for failure to respond to request for additional information.

Ward 6 Democrats received a \$2,000 fine for failure to file a January 31, 2015

report of receipt and expenditure. Libertarian 1 2 Party of the District of Columbia received a \$500 3 fine for failure to file on January 31, 2015 4 report of receipts and expenditures. 5 And Youth Action PAC received a \$2,000 fine for failure to file a December 10, 2014 6 report of receipt and expenditure. During the 7 month of May no petitions or enforcement were 8 transmitted to the Office of General Counsel for 9 10 the Board of Elections. 11 During the month of May the Office of 12 the General Counsel carried seven open 13 investigations which were pending and no new 14 investigations were opened. During the month of 15 May there were no requests for interpretive 16 opinions and no show cause proceedings were 17 conducted. That should conclude my report. 18 CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Thank you, Mr. 19 Sanford. 20 Are there any questions for Mr. 21 Sanford? 22 All right. Are there any members of

the public who wish to bring matters before the Board this morning? There being no further business before the Board, this meeting is adjourned at 11:02 a.m. Wednesday, June 3, 2015. (Whereupon, the above-entitled matter went off the record at 11:02 a.m.)
