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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	(12:48 a.m.)
3	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Good afternoon.
4	I hereby call to order the special meeting of
5	the Board of Elections. The purpose of this
6	meeting is to conduct a hearing to formulate
7	the Short Title and Summary Statement, and
8	legislative form of the proposed initiative
9	entitled "No Worker Shall Make Less Than the
10	Minimum Wage Act of 2014," and to approve the
11	petition form for the Fair Minimum Wage Act of
12	2014.
13	It is Wednesday, June 25th, 2014.
14	The time is 12:49 p.m.
15	I'm Deborah K. Nichols, chairman
16	of the board. Accompanying me this afternoon
17	are Member Stephen Danzansky. Also present on
18	the dias is our general counsel, Mr. Kenneth
19	McGhie, and our executive director, Mr.
20	Clifford Tatum.
21	Our first order of business is to
22	conduct the hearing to formulate the Short

1	Title and Summary Statement for No Worker
2	Shall Make Less Than the Minimum Wage Act of
3	2014. I'll ask the parties to come forward to
4	the table. A draft formulation of the Short
5	Title and Summary Statement has been prepared.
6	I will ask our general counsel to
7	read it into the record.
8	MR. MCGHIE: Okay. This would be
9	Initiative Measure No. 74. The short title is
10	No Worker Shall Make Less Than the Minimum
11	Wage Act of 2014.
12	` The Summary Statement reads as
13	follows:
14	"If enacted, the No Worker Shall
15	Make Less Than the Minimum Wage Act of 2014
16	will increase the minimum wage in the District
17	of Columbia to \$12.50 hourly, or one dollar
18	above the federal minimum wage, whichever is
19	greater, by 2017; gradually increase the
20	minimum wage for tip employees, so that they
21	receive the same minimum wage as other
22	employees by 2012; beginning in 2018, require

1	the minimum wage to increase yearly in
2	proportion to increases in the Consumer Price
3	Index; and ensure that the minimum wage
4	increases will not apply to D.C. Government
5	employees, or employees of D.C. Government
6	contractors."
7	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Are there any
8	suggestions from the Board, or interested
9	parties, as to any changes to the Short Title
10	and Summary Statement formulation? Have any?
11	(No response)
12	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right.
13	Hearing none, the Board has five days from
14	today to submit the Short Title to the D.C.
15	Register Short Title and Summary Statement,
16	in legislative form, to the D.C. Register for
17	publication.
18	If any qualified registered
19	elector of the District objects to the Summary
20	Statement, Short Title, or legislative form of
21	the measure, anyone who does that may seek
22	review in Superior Court within ten calendar

1	days from the date the Board publishes the
2	Short Title.
3	I will now attain a motion to
4	adopt the Short Title, Summary Statement, and
5	legislative form as read by the general
6	counsel, subject to minor technical edits.
7	BOARD MEMBER DANZANSKY: Madam
8	Chair, I move we adopt the language as read in
9	the record by the general counsel.
10	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right. The
11	motion is before us. All in favor, aye.
12	(Chorus of ayes)
13	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All opposed?
14	Hearing none, the motion carries.
15	If there are no further questions,
16	thank you all for coming. We will see you back
17	soon, so that we can do the petition form.
18	MR. MCGHIE: Yes. If there are
19	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: If there are no
20	objections or challenges. All right? Thank
21	you so much. Thank you. Thank you so much.
22	Appreciate it.

1	(Pause)
2	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right.
3	Okay. We will now move to the approval of the
4	Petition Form for Initiative Measure No. 73,
5	Fair Minimum Wage Act of 2014. Is there
6	anyone here to represent thank you, sir.
7	Come and identify yourself for the record,
8	please.
9	REVEREND JONES: I'm Reverend
10	Edwin Jones.
11	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right.
12	Reverend Jones. Okay. Mr. McGhie, would you
13	or I can.
14	"Pursuant to D.C. Official Code
15	Section 1001.16(G), the Board must approve an
16	initiative or referendum petition form before
17	it can be circulated. The Board is required to
18	prepare and provide to the proposer at a
19	public hearing an original form, which the
20	proposer must formally adopt as his or her own
21	form."
22	Mr. McGhie will now present the

1	petition form and
2	REVEREND JONES: Thank you.
3	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Okay. We'll
4	give you a chance to look that over and see if
5	you approve of the petition form, and would
6	adopt it as your own form.
7	(Rev. Jones reviews the form)
8	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Yes, sir?
9	REVEREND JONES: Okay. I had had
10	an opportunity to read the statement and we do
11	accept this petition as presented.
12	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: We want to make
13	a clarification. We need to know what the
14	proper initiative number is for this, because
15	we have 73 on one document. We have 72 on
16	another document. And even for your petition
17	not petition your initiative number. So
18	what is the correct initiative number?
19	MS. BROOKS: It should be it is
20	72, and the next one will be 73.
21	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: No Worker
22	MS. BROOKS: No Worker

1	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: is 73.
2	MS. BROOKS: 73. Yes.
3	(Simultaneous speaking)
4	MS. BROOKS: 72 is the Fair
5	Minimum Wage Act of 2014.
6	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Yes. We're
7	going to have to
8	(Simultaneous speaking)
9	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: You'll be 73.
10	Not 74. And what do we do to clarify the
11	record on that?
12	MR. MCGHIE: I think it's a
13	technical error then.
14	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Technical
15	error. Okay. That we can clear. All right.
16	Thank you, Reverend Jones, for your patience.
17	We appreciate that.
18	Do Board Members have any
19	questions or comments?
20	(No response)
21	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: No? Mr.
22	Danzansky?

1	BOARD MEMBER DANZANSKY: No. I have
2	no comments, Madam Chair. Thanks.
3	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Okay. Well, I
4	would like to entertain a motion, and
5	substantially, the following form, that the
6	Board approve the petition form adopted by the
7	proponent of Initiative No. 72.
8	BOARD MEMBER DANZANSKY: Yes. I
9	move that we adopt the petition form for
10	Initiative No. 72. Did we submit a copy for
11	the record? Or do we need to?
12	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Yes.
13	BOARD MEMBER DANZANSKY: We do.
14	Okay. So moved.
15	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All in favor?
16	(Chorus of ayes)
17	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All opposed?
18	Hearing no opposition, the ayes
19	have it. Mr. McGhie.
20	MR. MCGHIE: Okay. The Registrar of
21	Voters has calculated, I guess, the signature
22	requirements and she's prepared to give that

1 right now.

CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Come forward,
Ms. Brooks, and read your calculations in to
the record, and outline the remainder of the
process.

MS. BROOKS: Okay. As you're aware, the petition submitted in support of Initiative Measure No. 72, Fair Minimum Wage Act of 2014, must contain the signatures of 5 percent of the voters registered in the District of Columbia, provided that this total includes 5 percent of the registered voters in each of five or more wards. Pursuant to D.C. Official Code Section 1-204.102, this number is based on the latest official count of registered voters by the Board of Elections, which was issued 30 or more days prior to the submission of signatures.

While the requirement cannot yet be determined, I have calculated for the information of proponent and opponent what this requirement would be, if the most recent

1	voter registration figures published by the
2	Board were used, which is indicated in the
3	chart below.
4	For this initiative, you would
5	need 22,608 signatures, total, at least 5
6	percent of each ward, which is reflected in
7	short. I'll give you a copy.
8	Proponents and opponents are
9	advised to check with the Board on a monthly
10	basis, as new statistics are issued, to get
11	up-to-date estimates of the signature
12	requirement. In addition, the 180 day period
13	for circulating the petition pursuant to D.C.
14	Official Code Section 1-1001.16(J)(1) expires
15	on Monday, Decca Finance Service 22nd, 2014,
16	at 5:00 p.m.
17	Should the proponent wish to place
18	this measure on the ballot at the November
19	4th, 2014 general election, the petition must
20	be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. on
21	Monday, July 7, 2014.
22	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: July 7?

1	MS. BROOKS: Yes. Seven. 2014.
2	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right. Are
3	there any questions, Reverend Jones?
4	REVEREND JONES: No; no.
5	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: All right.
6	Thank you so much. Are there any other matters
7	to be brought before the Board this afternoon?
8	(No response)
9	CHAIRMAN NICHOLS: Hearing none,
10	without objections, this special meeting is
11	adjourned. The time is 1:01 p.m. It is still
12	June 25th, on Wednesday, 2014.
13	(Whereupon, at 1:01 p.m., the
14	special meeting adjourned.)
