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The District of Columbia Board of Elections convened a Regular Board Meeting in Room 280 North, 441 4th Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., 20001, pursuant to notice at 10:30 a.m., Stephen I. Danzansky, Acting Chairman, presiding.

ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Good morning.

My name is Stephen Danzansky, and I will be serving today as the Acting Chairman of the Board of Elections.

My colleague, our Chairman, Deborah Nichols, could not be here today, and in the absence of a quorum, therefore, there will be no official business conducted at this meeting. So today's meeting will only be for the receipt of reports by Board senior staff, and of course, to record any public matters that might be raised today.

Let me now introduce our senior staff, to my left is our Executive Director Clifford Tatum, to my immediate right is our General Counsel Kenneth J. McGhie, and to my far right is our Director of Campaign Finance, Cecily Collier-Montgomery.

MS. COLLIER-MONTGOMERY: Good morning.

ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Today's date

is Wednesday, October 7, 2015, and the time is 10:41. We move to the first item on the agenda.

We have published a public agenda, and even though this is an unofficial meeting, the public certainly may use this as a guide to the reports that will be submitted today.

So there will be no official adoption of an agenda this morning and the same with minutes, which is the second item, because there is no quorum, and this is -- no official business can be done, there will be no adoption of the Board's minutes.

That will take place at the November 4 meeting of the Board, when the minutes of September 2, which was the prior meeting, will be officially adopted. So that will happen on the 4th.

The third item on the agenda is Board matters, and I have -- as the sole surviving Board Member, have no particular business to raise at this time. So we'll turn now to the Executive Director's Report. Mr. Tatum.

MR. TATUM: Thank you, sir. On my report for today, I have general matters, and there are a number of items I'd like to put on the record and bring to the Board's attention.

The Board of Elections participated in National Voter Registration Day, which was September the 22nd, 2015. Our office conducted voter registration drives at six locations throughout the city, and those locations were the Duke Ellington School of the Arts, Gallaudet University.

We participated with the League of Women Voters at the Safeway at the Alabama Avenue in Southeast D.C. We conducted a drive here at One Judiciary Square. We also conducted a drive at the National Collegiate Prep High School and at the University of D.C. Community College on North Capitol Avenue.

We participated in the activities for the -- over the course of the full day. We collected 221 voter registration applications and 31 poll worker applications. So all in all, it

was a successful day.

WHUR provided on-air coverage at the University of D.C. Community College from 12:00 to 1:00, and that was good. We had an opportunity to say a couple -- share a couple words with the public on air. And of course we partnered with the League of Women Voters, that's always a good thing for us. So that concludes the matter on the National Voter Registration.

We wanted to give the Board an update on our canvass activities. As of September 30, 2015, the Board has taken -- staff has updated 46,897 records as a result of the 2015 canvass. Which means we have either changed addresses, made voters inactive, or removed voters from the roll as a result of being deceased or moved out of state, as a result of the canvas. Those cards are continuously coming in, so there's continuous activity on the canvass throughout the year -- throughout the remainder of the calendar year.

We'd like to bring to the Board's attention that the Fiscal Year 2016 officially

began on October the 1st, so all expenditures moving forward will be cached against the 2016 budget.

We were appropriated \$7,390,254 from the Mayor and the Council and of that \$7 million, \$2,846,600 is allotted for the June 2016 primary elections. So all expenditures that are being made now are coming from the 2016 allocated budget -- appropriated budget, and we are moving fast in to expenditures for the 2016 primary election.

ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Okay.

MR. TATUM: Last but not least, we have finalized our online signature exchange program, which means voters can now register online and not have to print the form and mail the form to us. If they have a DMV-issued identification report, we'll pull the signature over from DMV and finalize the process.

We're updating our website and anticipate that website page being available on this Friday, October the 9th.

ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Great. 1 2 MR. TATUM: And all voters with a DMVissued ID will finalize their application by 3 simply completing the data online. 4 5 Folks with the last four digits of their Social Security number will still have to 6 print the form and mail it into us, but we've 7 made that clear on the website as well and we'll 8 do some publications associated to this -- to the 9 new online process. 10 11 ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Great. MR. TATUM: That's all I have. 12 13 ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Great. Okay. 14 Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Tatum. Mr. McGhie. 15 MR. MCGHIE: Okay. The only thing I have on my agenda is a litigation status update. 16 We have only one matter pending in court right 17 now, and that is Harry Wingo versus the D.C. 18 Board of Elections. 19 20 mentioned at the last meeting, this was a matter brought by Mr. Wingo 21 to challenge the formulation of the short title 22

and summary statement of the initiative dealing with the minimum wage, and the Board filed a consent motion to expedite the proceedings, which was granted on September 2nd. So now under that expedited procedure, the Board will be filing its motion for summary judgment on this Friday, October 9th, and the Plaintiffs -- let's see, opposition and crossmotion by the Plaintiffs is due on October 26, and a reply by the Board of Elections and the Intervenors is due on November 9th. The final reply is November 16th, and then the hearing is set for November 19th. ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: November 19th. MR. MCGHIE: Yes. ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Okay. Do we have a judge? MR. MCGHIE: The judge is Maurice A. Ross. ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Ross. MR. MCGHIE: Ross. ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Okay.

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1 you. 2 MR. MCGHIE: And that would conclude my litigation status update. 3 ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Thank you, Mr. 4 5 McGhie. Campaign Finance? MS. COLLIER-MONTGOMERY: Yes. During 6 the month of September, the first thing I would 7 report was that there were no statutory filing 8 dates. We did have new candidates and committees 9 participate the registered to in 2016 10 who 11 election cycle. David Grosso, Grosso At-Large 2016 12 (At-Large City Council), registered on September 13 the 15th, 2015. Yvette Alexander, Re-Elect 14 (Ward 7 City Council), Yvette Alexander 2016 15 registered on September the 24th, 2015. Brandon 16 17 Todd, Re-Elect Brandon Todd (Ward City Council), registered on September the 28th, 2015. 18 conduct entrance conferences in 19 the conferences 20 September. We conducted on The participants were September the 3rd, 2015. 21 candidate David Oberting, treasurer, 22

Oberting2016. Erika Wadlington, treasurer,
Committee for Fair Employment Laws.

Also on September the 25th, 2015, entrance conferences were conducted and the participants were Yvette Alexander, candidate, Re-Elect Yvette Alexander 2016; Michael J. Fortunato, treasurer, Grosso At-Large 2016; David Grosso, candidate, Grosso At-Large 2016.

In our Audit Branch -- during the month of September, the Audit Branch conducted 80 desk reviews of reports that had been filed with the agency of political action committees, as well as of principal campaign committees, and of one initiative committee.

Tue Audit Branch referred four cases to the Office of the General Counsel where there for additional information were requests addressed to the various filers, which were the either not responded to, or for which information provided did not comply with auditors' requests. The Audit Branch also participated in four of the entrance conferences

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With respect to ongoing audits, our full field audits are as follows, of the investigative audits, we have Gray For Mayor. With the inaugural committees 2015, we have D.C. Proud inaugural committee. With respect to our newly-elected officials for 2014 and 2015, we have LaRuby May 2015, Brandon Todd for Ward 4, Brianne for D.C., Charles Allen for Ward 6.

With respect to our periodic random audits, ongoing the audits are: one, candidates registered for the 2015 election cycle, and that is of the January 31st, filing, Barry for Council. With our continuing committees -- and this is with the January 31st, 2015 filing -- Morgan for D.C.

With respect to political action committees and continuing committees, the July 31st, 2015 filing: Eric Jones 2014, Fresh PAC, and the Libertarian Party of D.C.

We also issued an audit report during the month of September and that Holness for D.C.,

which was issued on September the 21st, 2015, and 1 that audit report is available at our website for 2 members of the public to review. 3 And now I would ask the General 4 Counsel to provide the report for the Office of 5 the General Counsel. 6 7 ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Good morning, Mr. Sanford. 8 MR. SANFORD: Good 9 morning, 10 distinguished Board Member Danzansky. William Sanford, General Counsel for the Office 11 12 of Campaign Finance. 13 During the month of September 2015, the Office of the General Counsel received four 14 referrals from the Reports Analysis and Audit 15 16 Division. The Office of the General Counsel 17 completed nine informal hearings and issued 15 18 19 orders, which included the following: six orders were issued for failure to timely file reports 20 and fines were imposed that totaled \$7,750; seven 21

orders were issued for failure to timely file

reports in which no fines were imposed; and two 1 2 orders were issued that have vacated -- to vacate previous 3 orders based upon the payment performance. 4 Office of the General Counsel 5 6 imposed fines against the following respondents: D.C. Latino Caucus PAC, \$300; Gertrude Stein Democratic PAC, \$1,400; Youth Action PAC, \$1,400; 8 Bell for Ward 8 Council, \$1,550; Whitaker for 9 Ward 4, \$1,550; Trayon White for Ward 8 2015, 10 \$1,550. 11 The Office of the General Counsel 12 collected a total of \$325 in fines from the 13 following respondents: \$100 from D.C. Working 14 15 Families; \$100 from Campaign Committee Working Families; and \$125 from Ward 6 Democrats. 16 17 During the month of September, Office of the General Counsel maintained a total 18 of seven open investigations from prior months 19 20 and no new investigations were opened. During the month of September 2015, 21

there were no requests for interpretive opinions

1 and no show cause proceedings were conducted, and that should complete my report. 2 ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: All right. 3 Thank you very much, Mr. Sanford. All right. Now we turn to the next 5 6 item on the agenda, which is public matters. Does any member of the public wish to come forward and state for the record a public matter? As I said, 8 9 this is not an official meeting, but your concerns will be recorded. 10 (No audible response.) 11 ACTING CHAIR DANZANSKY: Hearing none, 12 this unofficial meeting of the Board of Elections 13 is hereby concluded.
