MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF ELECTIONS REGULAR MEETING

November 3, 2021

The District of Columbia Board of Elections (the Board) held its Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, November 3, 2021, telephonically. Board Members Karyn Greenfield and Mike Gill were present. The Board's Executive Director, Monica Evans, the Board's General Counsel, Terri D. Stroud, the Director of the Office of Campaign Finance (OCF), Cecily Collier-Montgomery, and the OCF's General Counsel, William Sanford were also present.

BOE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S OCTOBER 2021 REPORT (EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR EVANS)

• General Information

- Staff training is ongoing for the new voter registration system, Voter Focus, which was launched on September 28, 2021.
- Testing for the DS200 voting equipment has been completed with assistance from the Office of the Chief Technology Officer (OCTO).
- The Board is 100% compliant with the mayor's order requiring all staff to be fully vaccinated or undergo weekly COVID testing.
- During the month of October, the Voter Education and Outreach Division (VEOD)
 participated in 14 formal outreach events during the month, including a voter
 registration drive held at Gallaudet University on October 27, 2021 which will take
 place annually going forward.
- The Data Services Division is continuing to reconcile and transfer records from the previous voter registration system, Integrity, to the new system, Voter Focus. During the month, 1,797 voter cards were processed.
- The development of online and training content for election workers is currently in the process and will be held in conjunction with the 4-hour in-person mandatory training.

BOE OGC OCTOBER 2021 REPORT (GENERAL COUNSEL STROUD)

• Litigation Status

- o Long v. D.C. Board of Elections
 - This matter was filed in D.C. Superior Court on July 2, 2021. This is a civil complaint seeking \$10,000 in damages for negligence and unjust enrichment. Mr. Long alleges that the Board issued him a check without informing him not to deposit it, then had payment of the check stopped, causing him to have a negative balance and a returned check fee.
 - The Board is being represented in this matter by the OAG, which serves as counsel for the Office of Finance and Resource Management, the entity that managed the issuance of poll worker checks for the Board.
 - There was an initial hearing on August 9, 2021. The matter was continued to October 12, 2021, and on that date the matter was continued again to December 14, 2021.

OCF OCTOBER 2021 REPORT (DIRECTOR COLLIER-MONTGOMERY)

The Fair Elections Program (FEP) and Traditional Campaign Finance Program (TCFP) revised fact sheets and information sheets are posted on the OCF Website.

Community Outreach

The OCF continues to focus its efforts on sharing information about the TCFP and FEP with residents across the city. During October 2021, the OCF did not participate in any Community Outreach.

• Fair Elections Program Division (FEP) Report for October 2021

- Authorized Base Amount and Matching Payments
 - During the 2020 Election Cycle, the total sum of \$4,016,797.64 was disbursed from the Fair Elections Fund in Base Amount and Matching Payments to the 36 candidates certified in the FEP to participate in the June 2, 2020 Primary Election ("the Primary Election"), the June 16, 2020 Special Election ("the Special Election"), and the November 3, 2020 General Election ("the General Election"). The 2020 Election Cycle closed on November 3, 2020, and the 2020 Special Election Cycle closed on June 16, 2020.
 - As of November 3, 2021, a total sum of \$385,215 has been authorized for disbursement from the Fair Elections Fund in Base Amount and Matching Payments to five candidates certified to participate in the FEP in the June 21, 2022 Primary Election ("the 2022 Primary Election").
 - There were five candidates certified as in the FEP for the 2022 Election Cycle:
 - ➤ Brianne Nadeau, Brianne for DC 2022, certified on October 25, 2021, for the office of Member of the Council from Ward 1
 - \$40,660.00 in Matching Payments was authorized for disbursement.

- Faith Gibson Hubbard, Friends of Faith Ward 5 2022, certified on October 25, 2021, for the office of Member of the Council from Ward 5
 - \$47,775.00 in Matching payments and \$20,000.00 for one half of the Base Amount payment were authorized for disbursement.
- ➤ Erin Palmer, Erin for DC, certified on October 25, 2021, for the office of Chairman of the Council
 - \$133,075.00 in Matching payments and \$20,000.00 for one half of the Base Amount payment were authorized for disbursement.
- ➤ Gordon Fletcher, Gordon Fletcher for Ward 5, certified on September 1, 2021
 - \$5,525.00 was additionally authorized for disbursement in Matching payments.
