DCBOE Reminds Military, Overseas Voters to Plan for the June 16, 2026 Elections

The deadline for voter registration by mail, online is May 26

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The District of Columbia Board of Elections (DCBOE) is reminding military and overseas civilian voters to prepare for participation in the June 16, 2026 Primary Election and Special Election.

The following are important deadlines applicable to military and overseas voters:

- Voter registration applications and updates to existing registrations that are submitted by mail or online must be received by **Tuesday, May 26, 2026**. You can use the [Federal Postcard Application \(FPCA\)](#), DCBOE's [voter registration application](#), or the [Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot \(FWAB\)](#) to register to vote.
- Requests for an Absentee Ballot must be received by **Saturday, June 13, 2026**.
- Mailed Absentee Ballots must be postmarked by **Election Day, Tuesday, June 16, 2026** and **received by Friday, June 26, 2026**.
- E-mailed or faxed Absentee Ballots must be **received by Tuesday, June 16, 2026 at 8:00 pm ET**.

The June 16, 2026 Primary Election will include the following contests:

- Delegate to the United States House of Representatives
- Mayor of the District of Columbia
- Chairman of the Council of the District of Columbia
- At-large Member of the Council of the District of Columbia
- Ward Member of the Council of the District of Columbia (Wards 1, 3, 5 & 6)
- Attorney General
- United States Senator
- United States Representative
- National and Local Party Committee Members including:
 - National Committeeman of the Democratic State Committee
 - National Committeewoman of the Democratic State Committee
 - At-large Committeeman of the Democratic State Committee
 - At-large Committeewoman of the Democratic State Committee

- Ward Committeeman of the Democratic State Committee (All wards)
- Ward Committeewoman of the Democratic State Committee (All wards)
- Ward Republican Chairperson (All wards)

The June 16, 2026 Special Election will include the following contest:

- At-large Member of the Council of the District of Columbia (non-Democratic Party)

In addition, ranked choice voting (RCV) in DC will begin with the June 16, 2026 Primary and Special Elections. RCV is a voting method that allows voters to rank candidates in order of their preference. In DC, RCV is used in eligible contests with three or more candidates, and voters may rank up to five candidates, including write-in candidates. RCV allows your vote to count towards another candidate if your first-choice candidate does not receive enough votes. Military and overseas voters who do not receive their ballots in time may use the FWAB to vote. To vote using the FWAB, please read the instructions carefully.

Fill out the Voter Information section of the form completely and remember to sign and date the form. In the Official Backup Ballot section, write the title of the office you wish to make a selection for (unless it is already provided) and then privately write in the name of your candidate of choice or that candidate's party affiliation. (If a contest allows you to vote for more than one candidate, write in no more names than the maximum number of candidates for whom you are allowed to vote.) You are not required to make a selection for each and every contest.

The District of Columbia has a closed primary. This means that you must be registered with a political party (Democratic, Republican, or DC Statehood Green) in order to vote in the Primary Election, and you may only vote for the candidates in the party with which you are affiliated.

All eligible registered DC voters will be able to vote in the Special Election.
