 - b. Rulemaking
 1. Final Rulemaking - The purpose of the rulemaking is to conform the Board’s regulations to District law, including the Local Residents Voting Rights Amendment Act of 2022. The rulemaking also reflects court decisions rendered in cases concerning Initiative Measure No. 82, “the “District of Columbia Tip Credit Elimination Act of 2021.” In addition, the rulemaking updates and/or clarifies Board procedures for various activities, including meetings (including hearings), the issuance of Board orders and advisory opinions, and ballot access for candidates and ballot measures. The amendments also make other non-substantive housekeeping updates and corrections of typographical and formatting errors.
 2. Proposed Rulemaking - The purpose of the rulemaking is to correct errors to a rule that expresses the elections in which non-citizens can participate and a rule that indicates which offices non-citizens can vote for, and to conform certain of the Board’s regulations regarding its notice/agenda, closed-session, and minutes procedures to the District of Columbia government’s Open Meetings Act.
