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- 1 PROCEEDINGS
- 2 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: Good morning.
- 3 Welcome to the regular meeting of the Board of
- 4 Elections for the month of February, 2016. It is
- 5 Wednesday, February 3rd, 2016. The time is 10:40
- 6 a.m. We are meeting at 1 Judiciary Square, Room
- 7 280 North.
- 8 I'm Deborah K. Nichols, Chairman of the
- 9 Board of Elections. Accompanying me this morning
- 10 on the dais are Board Members Dionna Lewis, and
- 11 Stephen Danzansky. Also on the dais are Acting
- 12 Executive Director, Terry Stroud, our General
- 13 Counsel, Mr. Ken McGhie, and our Director of
- 14 Campaign Finance, Cecily Collier-Montgomery.
- 15 Without objections the agenda for this
- 16 morning is adopted.
- 17 Unless there are corrections to the
- 18 minutes of our meeting of Wednesday -- can't be
- 19 December. Oh, January 6th, 2016, without
- 20 objection the minutes are adopted with the
- 21 provision that we can make technical amendments

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- 1 that may be necessary.
- 2 Are there any members of the Board who
- 3 wish to bring matters before the Board in this
- 4 public meeting?
- [No audible response.]
- 6 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Hearing
- 7 none we will move to receive the report of our
- 8 Acting Executive Director, Terri Stroud.
- 9 MS. STROUD: Good morning, everyone. The
- 10 first matter on the agenda for me is our
- 11 preparations for the primary election, which will
- 12 take place on June 14th, 2016. Our candidate
- 13 ballot access process began on Friday, January
- 14 22nd. We closed at noon that day due to the
- 15 upcoming inclement weather.
- 16 To date, 24 candidates have picked up
- 17 nominating petitions. We post the names of
- 18 candidates who have picked up nominating
- 19 petitions for the various contests daily no our
- 20 website in the Newsroom Section.
- 21 February 16th is the last day to submit a

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- 1 petition in support of an initiative measure for
- 2 the primary. And February 22nd is the first day
- 3 that any nominating petition may be filed.
- 4 Again, March 16th is the deadline for filing
- 5 nominating petitions for all candidates.
- 6 General matters, for the record, there
- 7 are 438,373 voters registered in the District of
- 8 Columbia as of January 31st. And we have
- 9 conducted list maintenance activities.
- 10 Specifically based upon information that we
- 11 received from EIRC, the Electronic Registration
- 12 Information Center, we mailed notices to
- 13 approximately 13,000 -- specifically, 13,650
- 14 individuals who appear to be registered both in
- 15 the District and another jurisdiction.
- In our mailing we asked the voters to
- 17 give us information about their voter
- 18 registration status by no later than February
- 19 18th, 2016, so that we can update our records.
- 20 And that's all I have for my report today, Madam
- 21 Chair.

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- 1 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Are
- 2 there any questions of Ms. Stroud?
- 3 [No audible response.]
- 4 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Hearing
- 5 none we will move to receive the report of our
- 6 general counsel, Mr. Kenneth McGhie.
- 7 MR. McGHIE: Okay. The only thing I have
- 8 on my agenda is a litigation status update. And
- 9 the only matter that we have pending in court is
- 10 Harry Wingo v. the Board of Elections, which the
- 11 Board is well familiar with. That was a
- 12 challenge to the Board's Short Title and Summary
- 13 Statement for Initiative 76 by the plaintiffs.
- 14 There was a -- oh, the matter has been
- 15 completely briefed by the parties and there was a
- 16 status hearing on last Friday, January 29th, at
- 17 which time the Judge ruled from the bench and the
- 18 judge denied our motion for summary judgment in
- 19 the intervener's motion for summary judgment, and
- 20 granted the plaintiff's motion for summary
- 21 judgment on the sole ground that the Board was

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- 1 not properly constituted because of a D.C. code
- 2 statute that dealt with -- that put a limitation
- 3 of 180 days on the hold-over provisions for
- 4 boards and commissions.
- 5 The judge felt that the D.C. code statute
- 6 overruled the Home Rule Act, because it was
- 7 passed after the Home Rule Act.
- 8 And so what has transpired since then is
- 9 that we have filed a motion to amend his
- 10 judgments. We filed that yesterday and the
- 11 Attorney General also filed a motion to
- 12 intervene, and both those are still -- both those
- 13 motions are pending. But I've just been informed
- 14 that the law clerk for the judge contacted us and
- 15 would like us to all confer on a briefing
- 16 schedule for a briefing schedule. So I'm
- 17 assuming now that he wants all the parties to
- 18 brief the issue of the legality of the Board's
- 19 action.
- 20 And that's where we stand now. So we
- 21 will contact all the parties when we leave here

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- 1 today, and confer with a briefing schedule.
- 2 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Are
- 3 there any questions of Mr. McGhie?
- 4 [No audible response.]
- 5 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Hearing
- 6 none we will move to receive the report of our
- 7 Campaign Finance Director, Ms. Cecily Collier-
- 8 Montgomery.
- 9 MS. COLLIER-MONTGOMERY: Yes. Good
- 10 morning. During the month of January there were
- 11 three calling deadlines in the office. The first
- 12 was for the Constituent Service Program, the
- 13 Report of Receipts and Expenditures was due on
- 14 January the 1st, 2016. We had 12 required
- 15 filers. All 12 timely filed and also
- 16 electronically filed their reports of receipts
- 17 and expenditures.
- January 1st, 2016 was also the deadline
- 19 for the filing of the Report of Receipts and
- 20 Expenditures from our Statehood Fund Program. We
- 21 have three required filers and all three timely

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- 1 filed and electronically filed their report.
- 2 January the 31st, 2016 was the deadline
- 3 for the filing of the Report of Receipts and
- 4 Expenditures by Principle Campaign Committee and
- 5 Political Action Committee. Because this date
- 6 fell on the weekend this business date upon which
- 7 the report was due was February the 1st. We had
- 8 147 required filers. In terms of the timely
- 9 filers as well as those who failed to file, and
- 10 also the number of electronic filing, we're still
- 11 in the process of collecting that data.
- 12 During the month of January we had four
- 13 new candidates and committees who registered to
- 14 participate in the 2016 election cycle. Delmar
- 15 Chesley, Chesley for D.C. Council Ward 7,
- 16 registered on January the 4th, 2016. Aaron
- 17 Holmes, Holmes of Ward 8 registered on January
- 18 the 14th, 2016. Robert Kabel, Kabel 2016,
- 19 Republican National Committeeman, registered on
- 20 January the 21st, 2016. Walter Deleon, Deleon
- 21 2016 registered as a candidate for At-large State

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- 1 Board of Education on January the 28th, 2016.
- We also held three entrance conferences
- 3 during the month of January. The first one was
- 4 on January the 12th, 2016. The attendees were
- 5 David Satterfield, Treasurer for Homan for DC NCW
- 6 and Oberting 2016; Samuel Hughes, Treasurer for
- 7 Chesley for D.C. Council, Ward 7; DeLmar Chesley,
- 8 Candidate Chesley for D.C. Council, Wart 7.
- 9 On January the 19th, 2016, the
- 10 participants were Robert White, Candidate, Robert
- 11 White At-Large 2016; Christy White, Treasurer,
- 12 Robert White At-Large 2016; George Jonathan
- 13 Caley, Treasurer of Jack Jacobson for School
- 14 Board.
- 15 And also on January the 27th, 2016, the
- 16 participants were LaRuby Z. May, Candidate for
- 17 Reelect LaRuby May; Monica Tahlisha Ray,
- 18 Treasurer for Reelect LaRuby May; Jakarya Branch,
- 19 Assistant Treasurer Reelect LaRuby May.
- 20 And as you know, again, training is
- 21 mandatory for all of our newly registered

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- 1 candidates and treasurers.
- 2 During the month of January in our Report
- 3 Analysis and Audit Division the Audit Division
- 4 conducted 30 dense reviews of financial reports
- 5 that have been filed as well as amended reports.
- 6 With respect to our ongoing audits with the
- 7 periodic random audits we have, of the continuing
- 8 committees, a periodic random audit which is
- 9 ongoing of the January 31st, 2015 filing of
- 10 Morgan for D.C. With our Constituent Service
- 11 Program, with respect to the October the 1st,
- 12 2015 filing, the Yvette Alexander Constituent
- 13 Service Fund. With our full field audits and
- 14 term of our ongoing audits of our newly elected
- 15 officials we have four. LaRuby May, 2015,
- 16 Brandon Todd for Ward 4, Brianne for D.C., and
- 17 Elissa, 2014.
- 18 With our investigative audits we have
- 19 one, Gray for Mayor. And with respect to that
- 20 investigative audit the audit report was issued,
- 21 completed on January the 29th, 2016 and is

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- 1 available at our website for review by members of
- 2 the public. I would ask the General Counsel to
- 3 give the report for the Office of the General
- 4 Counsel.
- 5 MR. SANFORD: Good morning, Madam
- 6 Chairman and distinguished Board Members. My
- 7 name is William Sanford, General Counsel for the
- 8 Office of Campaign Finance. During the month of
- 9 January 2016 the Office of General Counsel
- 10 received five referrals from the Reports Analysis
- 11 and Audit Division. The office completed five
- 12 informal hearings and issued four orders, which
- 13 included the following.
- 14 Two orders for failure to timely file
- 15 reports in which no fines were imposed, one order
- 16 regarding a motion for reconsideration in which
- 17 no fine was imposed, and one order regarding a
- 18 motion for reconsideration in which a fine
- 19 against the Committee Treasurer was vacated.
- 20 During the month of January the Office of
- 21 the General Council collected \$700 in fines from

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- 1 the following respondents. \$200 from Mark Jones
- 2 for the Reelect Mark Jones School Board campaign,
- 3 2014; \$200 from Beverly Wheeler, Beverly Wheeler
- 4 for Ward 1; \$250 from a Committee to Elect Ron
- 5 Molten, a candidate for Ward 7, and \$50 for the
- 6 Latino Caucus.
- 7 During the month of January the Office of
- 8 the General Counsel carried seven active
- 9 investigations, and no new investigations were
- 10 activated or opened. And during the month of
- 11 January 2016 there were no requests for
- 12 interpretive opinions, and no show-cause
- 13 proceedings were conducted. And that should
- 14 conclude my report.
- 15 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Are
- 16 there any questions of Mr. Sanford or Ms.
- 17 Collier-Montgomery?
- 18 [No audible response.]
- 19 CHAIRPERSON NICHOLS: All right. Hearing
- 20 none are there any public matters to be brought
