GENERAL ELECTION
AFTER-ACTION REPORT

#### I. Introduction:

Under D.C. Official Code §1-1001.05(K) and 3 DCMR § 817, within 90 days following a general election, the District of Columbia Board of Elections ("the Board" or "DCBOE") must publish on its website an after-action report containing certain data and information concerning the election. Accordingly, DCOBE presents this after-action report ("the Report") on the November 5, 2024 General Election ("the Election").

### II. Ballot Data:

The Election demonstrated a well-coordinated effort in the administration and processing of ballots across various voting methods, including Early Voting, Election Day voting, Mail-in ballots, and special ballots. A total of **328,871 ballots were cast**. Below are the key highlights and findings from this election cycle:

### A. Total Ballots Cast:


• Total Number of Ballots Cast: 328,871

• Ballots Cast During Early Voting: 72,914

• Ballots Cast During Election Day: 82,396

• Mail-in Ballots Cast (All Mail and Special Ballots): 173,561

- **B. Early Voting:** Early voting initiatives were implemented across 25 locations, providing flexible opportunities for voter participation. A total of 72,914 ballots were cast during this period. This represents 22.2% of total ballots cast. Key factors contributing to the success of early voting included:
  - Well-publicized schedules and locations.
  - Adequate staffing.
- **C. Election Day Voting**: The number of ballots cast on Election Day was 82,396, which accounts for 25% of total participation. This suggests that Election Day voting remains an important option for voters despite the growing preference for mail and early voting.
- **D.** Mail-in and Special Ballots: Mail-in ballots accounted for 52.8% of the total ballots cast, with 173,561 ballots submitted via mail and special ballot. Factors that contributed to this include:
  - Enhanced outreach campaigns highlighting mail-in voting options and deadlines.
  - High reliability in ballot tracking and verification systems, fostering voter confidence.
- **E. Special Ballots**: Special ballots, though constituting a small percentage of the total, were processed efficiently.

- **VII. Voter Registration Activity Data:** The Election's voter registration activity underscores the strength of voter engagement and highlights the importance of well-coordinated outreach, flexible registration options, and resourceful election planning.
  - A. Total Registered Voters More than 21 Days Preceding the Election (as of October 15, 2024):
    - Total number of registered voters: 464,502
    - This figure reflects the total number of voters registered more than 21 days before the election, categorized by ward, party, and precinct. The high number of preelection registrations indicates effective voter outreach and engagement efforts leading up to the election.
  - B. New Registrations Between 21 Days Preceding the Election and Election Day (October 15 to October 27, 2024):
    - New Registrations: 5,467
    - This number represents voters who registered within the two-week period before early voting began.
  - C. Same-Day Registrations (October 28 through November 5, 2024):
    - Total Same-Day Registrations: 14,118
    - Same-Day Registrations Before Election Day (During Early Voting): 5,790
    - Same-Day Registrations on Election Day: 8,328
