D. Final Rulemaking to Title 3, Chapter 5 of the D.C. Municipal Regulations (Elections and Ethics)

1. The purpose of the rulemaking is to clarify the obligations of the District of Columbia's Voter Registration Agencies under the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 [52 U.S.C. § 20501 *et seq.*] and the enforcement process that applies in the event of noncompliance with that Act.
2. The purpose of the rulemaking is to clarify the address that may be used by unhoused D.C. residents for voter registration purposes and the process for challenging registered voter status.
